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Assessment and Evaluation:

Your progress in this course will be evaluated using a variety of different assessment strategies that may include checklists, observations, group work, peer and self evaluation, projects, mental math, assignments, quizzes and tests.

Please note that evaluation for grades 7 will look slightly different than what you are used to in grade 6. In accordance with the Department of Education, students in grade 7 will receive numerical grades (percent) and not letter grades.
