

COURSE OUTLINE: GRADE 9 FRENCH IMMERSION

INTRODUCTION:

Welcome to Grade 9 French language Arts! The main outcomes of this program consist of:

- Think and learn
- Communicate effectively and clearly with a range of audiences and for a variety of purposes
- Gain, manage, and evaluate information
- Explore, respond to, and appreciate the power of language, literature, and other texts, and ways and places in which language is used

French class will review the language acquisition studied over the last two years. The focus will be on the oral and written aspects of the French language.

ORAL PRODUCTION AND COMPREHENSION:

The students will:

- respond to questions asked in class
- participate in group discussions
- role play
- participate in class presentations
- critique an article
- speak French during class (speaking and listening activities)
- reading and viewing activities

NOVEL STUDIES AND SHORT STORIES AND POETRY:

The students will read 3 or 4 novels throughout the year:

- Le Visiteur du Soir - Chateaux de Sable
- L'été sur le Richileu -reading circle of a novel.

The short stories will be a collection taken from a series called "Reflets Maritimes".

The poetry will come from a series called " J'aime les Poèmes".

CREATIVE WRITING AND GRAMMAIRE:

- The students will:
- complete grammar exercises relating to concepts being taught in class.
 - dictations
 - process writing
 - answering questions/expressing their opinions in written form
 - writing short stories/poems
 - research paper
